## HIT & RUN - PEDESTRIAN FATAL

### SUMMARY:

Report of a fatal accident, request of AI to scene. HAZEL PARK COMP # 16-15800.

### INFORMATION:

Undersigned trooper arrived at the below mention location and made contact with Ofc. MCCABE. MCCABE advised that a pedestrian riding a bicycle, crossing on John R was struck, and had serious life threatening injuries. MCCABE advise there was a witness to the incident, an off duty Detroit Police Officer. MCCABE requested assistance for the scene, in order to look for some type of evidence at the scene, because the suspect driver had fled from the scene, failing to stop and identify themselves.

MCCABE advised that the witness had advised him that the suspect and witness was at the light traveling n/b on John R. The suspect was not traveling fast, but the victim began to cross the roadway, not at the intersection, from the west side to the east side of the street. Suspect driver struck the pedestrian in the right lane, and ran over on top of him. The witness stated that he was not able to get the license plate of the vehicle, nor did he go after it. The witness pulled over and stayed with the victim, until help arrived. The witness did notice that the vehicle was some type of dark colored SUV. The suspect driver continued north on John R, then turned e/b on a street, failing to stop and identify themselves or give assistance.

### TROOPERS ACTION:

Undersigned trooper arrived on the scene and observed that the n/b lanes of traffic on John R was blocked by Hazel Park police vehicle at Woodward Hts Blvd. Undersigned trooper also notice that the area was blocked off with crime scene tape. Undersigned trooper notice a bicycle lying partially on the sidewalk with the rear tire damage and hanging over the curb, facing east bound. Also observed a black luggage bag lying not to far from the bicycle.

Further investigation revealed the location of the first impact when the vehicle struck the bicycle, along with drag marks of the pedestrian in the right lane, and a pool of blood where the pedestrian came to final rest. Undersigned trooper did not notice any debris from the vehicle after impact. Undersigned trooper notice that the street is well lite with street lamps.

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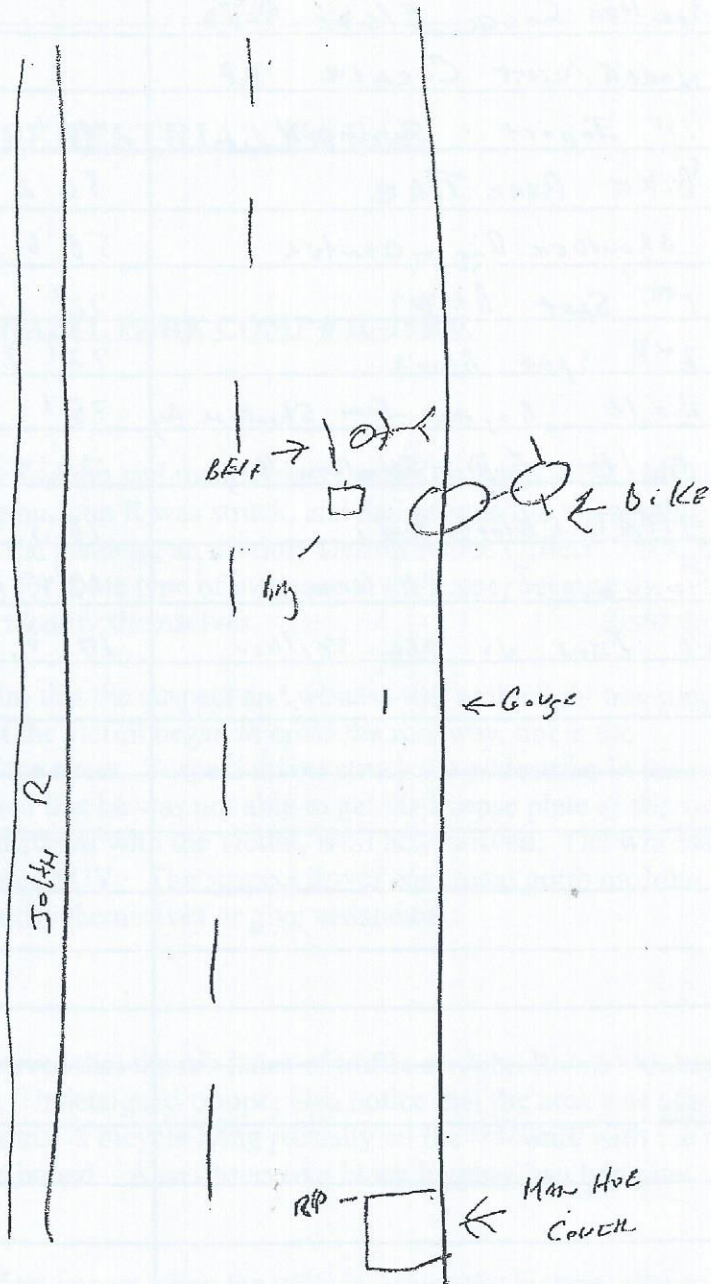
